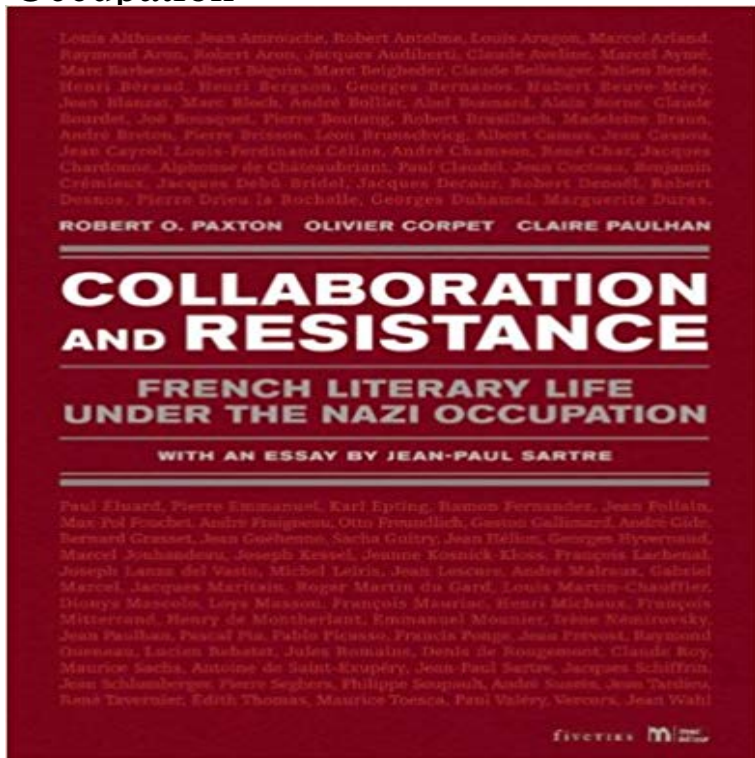


Collaboration and Resistance: French Literary Life Under the Nazi Occupation
